

# Acacia colei

*Acacia colei* is a perennial bush or tree native to Australia and southern Asia. A common name for it is **Cole's Wattle**. It grows to a height of up to 9 m. *Acacia colei* blooms from June through July and the flowers are bright yellow.<sup>[2]</sup>

## 1 Uses

Its uses include environmental management, forage and wood.<sup>[1]</sup> The seeds are good-tasting<sup>[3]</sup> and are potentially useful as food for humans. The results of tests in Nigeria for the feasibility of raising the tree as a drought-resistant food crop came out very positively.<sup>[4]</sup>
