## **Grumichama: A Tropical Cherry Tree**

Recently I was given a bowl of delicious, sweet little treats from a friend whose neighbour is growing them, and I think I ate nearly the whole bowl ... I had taste little fruit before and wondered "Why haven't I planted any of these trees alread

The beautiful tree is a Grumichama or Brazilian Cherry and its botanical name i Eugenia dombeyi.

This spectacular, evergreen perennial tree grows 3 to 5m in height, has about a spread and grows best in a sub-tropical to tropical environment. It's considered ornamental tree as well as edible as it produces an abundance of small cherryduring spring and summer after the flush of new growth. Being closely related t Syzigium (Lilly Pilly species) the new growth has a pinkish colouring and also h

The Grumichama can be grown to form a hedge, used as a wind break or to so attractive tree originates in South America and can be grown in part-shade to funo lime added to soil before planting) and will tolerate periods of wet conditions requires watering regularly once the fruit appears to allow for fruit to set.



When planting the tree, allow suffice than the root ball and include good soak the potted plant in a bucket of transplanting shock.

Cover with a mix of rotted manures and bone or chooks pellets to enco

Watering in well with a liquid fertilis good dose of nutrients to help estal retain moisture and nutrients.
