Amaranthus - Red: \$3.25

Ancient grain of the Aztec, can grow over 6', stunning colour displays. Seed can be popped and eaten as a snack

Aster, China: \$3.25

(Callistephus chinensis) Lovely Matsumota Mix wide colour range of 5 cm. blooms with yellow centers. Heat tolerant, strong straight stems and long bloom period. Great for cutting. Approx 100 seeds per packet.

Batchelors button: \$3.25

(Centaurea cyanus) (Perennial) Mixed couloirs. Edible.

Blanket Flower: \$3.25

(Gaillardia aristata) (Perennial) Beautiful yellow/red. Drought tolerant.

Calendula: \$3.25

(Calendula officinalis) Deep orange and gold. Edible flower. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Canterbury Bells: \$3.25

(Campanula glomerata) Seed originally from Ireland. Mixed blues, pink and white bell shaped flowers to 2' tall.



Cleome: \$3.25

Cleome-Spider Flower (C. spinosa) Nice tall plant with pink and white 'spider like' flowers. Approx. .25 gram per packet.

Columbine, mixed: \$3.25

(Aquilegia alpina) (Perennial) - Mixed colours. Beautiful spring flower.



Cosmos: \$3.25

(Cosmos bipinnatus) (Annual) Nice tall plant, purple and white flowers with lacy foliage.



Cup Plant: \$3.25

Perennial (Silphium perfoliatum) Sunflower like flowers with leaves attached to stems to form cups - finches and chickadees love the seeds and drinking from the cups.



Daisy, Zulu Prince: \$3.25

(Venidium fastuosum) (Annual) Nice delicate two tone.



Delphinium: \$3.25

Beautiful stately blue. Juice of the flowers mixed with alum gives blue ink. (Toxic to humans and livestock)



Ebony Shoe Fly: \$3.25

(Nicandra physalodes) (Annual) Blue Bell Flower. Large plant with black stems. Speckled foliage.



Edible Flower Collection: \$10.00

Edible Flower Collection. A collection of edible flowers for salads, garnishes, and desserts. Calendula, Corn Flower, Zebra Mallow, Orange Gem Marigold and Pansy.



Foxglove: \$3.25

(Digitalis purpurea) (Biennial) Pink. Wild Welsh variety, approx. 1. meter tall.



Gloriosa Daisy: \$3.25

(Rudbeckia hirta) (Perennial) Yellow, brown center.classic yellow daisy.

Hollyhock, Black: \$3.25

(Alcea ficifolia) (Perennial) Deep burgandy red.



Jackpot Tansy: \$3.25

(Tanacetum niveum) (Perennial) Silver grey foliage with white/yellow flowers. Not invasive.



Johnny Jump-up: \$3.25

Johnny Jump-up (Viola tricolor) Historic pansy, harbinger of spring. Edible. Approx. 25 seeds per packet.



Leopard Flower: \$3.25

(Belamcanda chinensis) (Perennial) Beautiful orange flowers with purple dots. Chinese medicinal. Approx. 45 Seeds per packet.



Lions Ear-Lions Tail: \$3.25

Lions Ear-Lions Tail (Leonotis Leonurus) (Annual) Tall, deep orange florets on prickly leaf axils, used as a euphoriant in Africa.



Lunaria: \$3.25

Lunaria: (Money Plant) Purplish pink flower, silver dollar discs in second year. Nice in dried arrangements.



Mallow, Zebra: \$3.25

(Malva sp.) Beautiful sweet edible, red/white blooms.



Marigold, Orange Gem: \$3.25

(Tagetes tenuifolia) (Annual) Citrus scented/flavoured.



Purple Cone Flower: \$3.25

(Echinacea purpurea) (Perennial) Beautiful, medicinal. Echinacea is popularly believed to be an immunostimulator, stimulating the body's non-specific immune system and warding off infections and also being used as a laxative.

Sea Holly: \$3.25

(Eryngium planum) (Perennial) Soft prickly, blue flowered. Attracts beneficial insects.



Snapdragon: \$3.25

(Antirrhinum majus) (Perennial) Mixed colours.



Viola, Fuji Dawn: \$3.25

Fuji Dawn Viola (Viola mandshurica) Free flowering, variegated foliage. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Yarrow, Red: \$3.25

(Achillea millefolium) (Perennial) Lovely red flower heads. Seeds can be slow to germinate, soak for 24 hours before planting.



Zinnia: \$3.25

(Zinnia elegans) (Annual) - Giant Zinnia. Mixed colours. Drought tolerant.

Ornamental: \$3.25

(Helianthus annuus) Mixed colours.

Aster, Showy: \$3.25

(Aster conspicuus) Wild perennial. Blue Flowers. Native peoples used roots as an antiseptic. Seed naturalized to Sunshine Farm.



Daisy, Arrow Park: \$3.25

(Anthemis tinctoria) Yellow. Excellent drought tolerant perennial. Seed naturalized to Sunshine Farm.

Lupin, Columbia Valley Wild: \$3.25

Columbia Valley Wild Lupin: Tall plant to 3', blue flowers, occasionally pink. Seed naturalized to Sunshine Farm.

Fruit



Aunt Mollys Ground Cherry: \$3.25

Physalis pruiniosa Profusion of small sweet berries encased in papery husks. Sprawling plants to 3 feet. 70 days from transplanting. 50 seeds per packet.



Citron, Green Seeded: \$3.25

Green Seeded Citron (Citrullus lanatus var. citroides) From the Kelowna Seed Swap. Watermelon looking melon used for making a delicious preserve with honey/sugar lemon and ginger - a traditional Christmas treat. Stores well. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Ground Cherry or Cape Gooseberry/Poha: \$3.25

Annual (Physalis Peruvians) Ground Cherry or Cape Gooseberry AKA Poha. Upright ground cherry with loonie sized fruit. Pineapple-strawberry flavour with a hint of coconut. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Hearts of Gold Melon: \$3.25

Cucumis melo. 70-90 days Aromatic 2-3 lb fruits with sweet golden flesh. Reliable and productive. Heirloom from early 1900's. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Melon, Charentais: \$3.25

Small French melon, deep orange flesh, considered by many to be the tastiest of all melons.



Melon, Golden Midget: \$3.25

(Citrullus lanatus) Golden rind, red flesh, sweet watermelon to 3 lbs.



Melon, Isreal Ogen: \$3.25

C. melon. 80-90 Days. Beautiful sweet, pale green flesh. Intoxicating aroma. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.

Melon, Minnesota Midget: \$3.25

Minnesota Midget Melon (Cucumis melo) 60-70 Days. Early variety, sweet, short vines. Productive, performed exceptionally well in the Okanagan Valley. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Sunberry: \$3.25

Sunberry (Solanum burbankii) 75 Days. Also known as 'wonderberry' developed by Luther Burbank, plant breeder genius. Small 1/4" berries. Good yield. Sweet, used for Pies and Jellies or just for snacking in the field. Approx. 200 Seeds per packet.

Grains



Millet, Dragons Claw: \$3.25

Dragons Claw Millet (Eleusine sp.)(approx 80 seeds) Unusual Millet with the heat that resembles the 'claws of a dragaon'.



Quinoa, Multi Hued: \$3.25

Quinoa Seeds (Chenopodium quinoa) Quinoa ("keen-wa") Stands 5-6 feet tall and has vibrant flower colours, red through orange, yellow, purple and mauve. In midsummer, a large seedhead develops, loaded with millet-like seeds which can be harvested after the leaves have dried. Quinoa germinates in fairly cool conditions and prefers light, well-drained soil. Plant in rows and thin to at least a foot apart for maximum growth. Leaves are good fresh or cooked through spring and summer. Quinoa is 15-16% protein and is high in E and B vitamins, calcium, iron and phosphorous. It is easy to digest and has a delicious flavour. It must be thoroughly rinsed before cooking and is then prepared like rice. Approximately 200 seeds per packet.



Wheat, Marquis: \$3.25

Marquis Wheat (Triticum aestivum) Heritage wheat variety developed by crossing Hard Red Calcutta wheat with Red Fife. By 1920 it was the predominant variety in Canada. Early maturing variety.



Wheat, Red Fife: \$3.25

Red Fife Wheat (Triticum aestivum) Heritage breadwheat is a landrace so it has the genetic variability to adapt to local conditions. Grown in Canada since the 1840's.

Greens



Arugula, Ortania: \$3.25

Arugula, Ortania (Annual) (Eruca sativa varietal) Special Market selection of Italian Arugula, consistent growth and flavour. Approx. 500 seeds per packet.

Asian Greens : \$3.25

A salad or steaming mix of mizuna, mustard greens, bok choi, tat soi - nice quick spring crop - sow in late March or early September for fall crop. Approx. 800 Seeds per packet.



Ching Chiang: \$3.25

Brassica rapa 'Baby Bok Choi' 25 to 30 days. Fast, cold tolerant. Nice for steaming or grilling.



Corn Salad, Vilmorins: \$3.25

(Valerianella locusta) Classic French variety, great cool weather salad green with distinctive sweet flavour. Approx. 650 Seeds per packet.



Cress, shallot: \$3.25

Shallot Cress (Lepidium sp) Interesting spoon shaped leaves with a peppery oniony flavour. Nice in the spicy salad mixes. Prefers the cool of the spring or fall. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Cress, Upland: \$3.25

(Barberea verna) Piquant 6"-8" rosettes of dark green glossy deeply indented leaves. Slow to bolt. Approx. 600 Seeds per packet.



Kale, Red Russian: \$3.25

Cold hardy, frilly leafed, purple/pink veins. Delicious at any stage. Eat fresh or steamed. Also delicious as 'Kale Chips'.



Malva Crispa: \$3.25

(malva verticillata)(Biennial) Great hot weather salad green. Domesticated in China very early in agricultural development. To 7' tall. Approx. 200 Seeds per packet.



Mustard Greens, Golden Frills: \$3.25

Golden Frills Mustard Greens. (Brassica juncea) Lacy, fast growing, bright, light green leaves. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.



Mustard Greens, Green Frills: \$3.25

Green Frills Mustard Greens Beautiful delicate frilly leaves. Spicy flavour, but mild enough to be eaten raw. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.

Mustard Greens, Green Wave: \$3.25

Slow to bolt, frilly leaves, great when small for salad mix or bunches when larger. Spiciness diminishes when cooked. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.



Mustard Greens, Ruby Streaks: \$3.25

Ruby Streaks Mustard Greens. Beautiful deep burgundy lacy leaf with sweet spiciness. Colourful elegance. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.



Mustard Greens-Green: \$3.25

(Brassica juncea) (Annual) Nice steamed or wrapped around fish, or as baby greens. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.



Mustard, Giant Red: \$3.25

Giant Red Mustard (A)(Brassica juncea) Spicy purple/red leaves, beautiful as a baby in salad mix. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.



Orach, Red: \$3.25

(Artiplex hortensis) (45 Days to maturity)(Annual) Nice red Spinachy flavoured addition to salads.



Pepper Grass, Curly: \$3.25

Lepidium sativum Looks almost like curled parsley, nice spicy addition to salads or sandwiches. Rapid growing, harvest 2 weeks after sowing, keep clipped and succession plant for continuous supply.



Purslane, Golden: \$3.25

(Portulaca oleracea sativa) Large succulent leaves excellent source of omega 3, great in salad mixes.



Quillquina: \$3.25

(Porophyllum ruderale)(Annual) Culinary and medicinal from Bolivia, reminiscent of cilantro and arugula cross. Approx. 50 Seeds per packet.



Salad Mix, Savory: \$3.25

Salad Mix, Savory: Dill, chervil, arugula, lettuce, and mustard greens. A nice savory blend of flavours and shapes and textures. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.

Salad mix, Spicy: \$3.25

Salad mix with peppergrass, mustard varieties, arugulas and lettuces. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Salad mix, Spring: \$3.25

Early salad mix with mizuna, tatsoi, spinach, sweet mustard and lettuce mix. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Salad Mix, Tangy: \$3.25

Tangy Salad Mix - Chives, lettuce, mustard greens, cress, arugula and cilantro. Wake up your taste buds with a spicy salad. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Sorrel, Red Veined: \$3.25

(Rumex sanguineus) Interesting colour but lacks flavour. Chefs use as a colourful garnish. Use only when young.



Spilanthes Cress: \$3.25

(Spelanthis oleracea)(Annual) Also called the toothache plant, adds unusual zest to salads. Approx. .5 gram per packet.



Spinach, Malabar: \$3.25

(Basella alba) (Tender Perinnial) Crunchy succulent with spinachy flavour, though not a spinach. Prefers hot weather, and to be trellised, prolific. Approx. 20 seeds per packet.

Greens/Spinach



Spinach, Bloomsdale: \$3.25

(Spinacia oleracea) 50 days to maturity. Standard for garden flavour excellence. Approx. 50 Seeds.



Spinach, New Zealand: \$3.25

(Tetragonia) Very nice warm weather type salad green or steamed green. Can be difficult to germinate, soak seed for 2 hours before planting. Approx. 50 Seeds.

Ambrosia: \$3.25

(Chenopoduim botrys) (Annual) Aromatic oak shaped leaves. Nice dried foliage.



Anise Hyssop: \$3.25

(Agastache foeniculum) Prolific, sweet licorice herb with striking blue flowers. Self seeds quite nicely.



Basil, Maui Lime: \$3.25

Nice pungent lime flavour. Found on Maui in January, 2012.



Basil, Mexican Wild: \$3.25

Mexican Wild Basil: Found by the roadside near Boca de Naranja, Nayarit, Mexico. Absolutely the fruitiest fragrance of any basil we've grown -- sweet and not pungent. Sunshine Farm Exclusive.



Basil, Seratta: \$3.25

Very beautiful leaves, ruffled and serrated, good culinary and very decorative. Approximately 500 seeds.



Bergamot - Lemon: \$3.25

(monarda citriodora) Beautifully pink tinged tea herb.



Bergamot, Wild: \$3.25

Wild Bergamot (P) (Monarda fistulosa) (.5 g per packet) Tall lavender flowers, attractive fragrant plant, good for teas. Approx. .5 gram per packet.



Borage: \$3.25

(Borago officinalis) (Perennial) Cucumber flavoured herb with star shaped blue flowers, great in salads.



Chamomile, German: \$3.25

(Matricaria recutita) (Annual) Probably the best for tea, a profusion of flowers, very aromatic.

Chinese Motherwort: \$3.25

(Leonuris artemesia) Medicinal and decorative herb. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Chives: \$3.25

(Allium schoenoprasum) (Biennnial) Traditional variety.



Cilantro: \$3.25

(Coriandrum sativum) Annual. Spicy herb used in Mexican and Thai cuisine.j Attracts beneficials. Approx. 100 Seeds per packet.



Dill: \$3.25

(Anethum graveolens)(Annual) Mammoth, good salad garnish when young, and nice seed heads for making pickles. Large plant.



Dragon Head: \$3.25

(Dracochephalum moldavica) Lemony scented blue flowered tea herb, to 50 cm. tall. (approx 150 seeds per packet)



Elecampane: \$3.25

(Inula helenium) (Perennial) Medicinal and dye plant. Large soft leaves.



Epazote: \$3.25

(Chenopodium ambrosioides) (Annual) Exellent aromatic, good with baked beans, reputed antiflatulant.



Evening Primrose: \$3.25

(Oenothera biennis) (Biennial) Medicinal as seed oil. Attracts hawkmoth.



Horehound: \$3.25

(Marrubium vulgare) Perennial. Traditional remedy for coughs.

Hyssop - Giant Yellow: \$3.25

(Agastache nepetoides) Tender Perennial. 6' tall, yellow bloom. Medium sweet leaves, nice for tea.



Hyssop, Blue: \$3.25

(Hyssopus officinalis)(Perennial) Blue flowers, refreshing scent. Approx. 150 seeds per packet.

Hyssop, Giant Yellow: \$3.25

Giant Yellow Hyssop (TP) (Agastache nepetoides) (.5 g per packet) 6\' tall, yellow bloom. Medium sweet leaves, nice for tea.



Joe Pye Weed: \$3.25

Joe Pye Weed. (Eupatoruim purpureum) 12 foot herb with white cluster flowers. Leaves have diuretic properties.



Lavender: \$3.25

(Lavendula angustifolia) (Perennial) English, sweet, fragrant violet flowers. Approx. 40 seeds per packet.



Lemon Balm: \$3.25

(Melissa officinalis) (Perennial) Great lemon scent - good for tea and salad.



Lovage: \$3.25

(Levisticum officinale) Perennial. Great for soups, stocks and stews. Celery flavoured, tall vigorous plant. Approx. 75 seeds per packet.



Mint - Lemon Licorice: \$3.25

(Agastache mexicana) Perennial. 2' tall striking reddish flowers with a lemony licoricey flavour. Nice for sorbets or teas.



Mullein, Black: \$3.25

Culpeppers Black Mullein (B) (Verbascum sp) Short wooly leaves. Rosette in 1st year then flower stalk in 2nd year (Drought resistant) Interesting flower. Approx. .5 per packet.

Mullein, Great: \$3.25

(Verbascum thapsus) Biennial. Reputed cough/bronchitis remedy - stately plant to 7' with yellow flowers in the 2nd year.



Navaho Tea: \$3.25

(Thelasperma fillifolium) Very nice pleasant tasting tea herb. Pretty flowers, lacy foliage.



Oregano, Greek: \$3.25

(Origanum vulgare) (Perennial) Best oregano flavour for sauces and dressings. White flowers.



Oregano, Tarahumara: \$3.25

(Monarda astromontana) Not a true oregano, beautiful blue flowers, very aromatic. Excellent tea and garnish herb. Approx 100 seeds per packet.



Parsley, Hamburg: \$3.25

(Petroselinum crispum tuberosum) (Biennial) Use both leaves and root, very tasty.



Parsley, Italian: \$3.25

(Petroselinum neopolitanum) Biennial) Italian, excellent flavour, flat leaf. Chef's choice. Approx. 100 seeds per packet.



Sage: \$3.25

(Salvia officinalis) (Perennial) Garden variety, cook with onions, for poultry stuffing.



Salad Burnet: \$3.25

(Sanguisorba minor) (Perennial) Nut cucumber flavour, good in salads and dressings.



Savory - Summer: \$3.25

(Satureja hortensis) (Annual) Summer, very aromatic, great with beans.

Savory - Winter Dwarf: \$3.25

(Satureja montana) Perennial. Useful for culinary, pungent flavour, though not as aromatic as 'hortensis'.



Shepards Purse: \$3.25

Capsela bursa-pastoris. Used as food in East Asia as well as a medicinal for cardiovascular, hemostasis, and gynecological problems. Good in East Asian cuisine. Minimum 50 seeds per packet.



Vervain: \$3.25

(Verbena hastata) (Perennial) Blue flower spikes, medicinal.





François Tomatillo: \$3.25

Francois Tomatillo, exceptionally large green 6- 8 cm fruits. Sweet green apple flavour. Brought from Mexico. Excellent for sauces and fresh eating. Approx. 50 seeds.

Vegetables/Beans



Anasazi Bean: \$3.25

Anasazi Bean (80 to 90 Days to Maturity) Dry Bush Bean. Beautiful maroon and white bean, grown by the ancient Anasazi People of the American Southwest. Contains only 25% of the complex carbohydrates that cause flatulance. Sweet meaty texture. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Cherokee Trail of Tears: \$3.25

80-90 Days to maturity. Pole, 6' snap or dry bean. Cherokee people carried the seed to their reserve in Oklahoma in 1838 over the 'trail of tears' where many people died due to starvation. Black seed. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Dragons Tongue, bush: \$3.25

A snap or dry yellow with purple striping. Stays beautifully tender and is very productive.



French Wax Bean: \$3.25

French Wax Yellow Bean 53 Days to Maturity. Productive and versatile wax variety. Glossy, crisp yellow pods on 16-24" plants. Rich, buttery flavour. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

Haricot Tarbais: \$3.25

Haricot Tarbais (80 to 90 Days to Maturity) Dry Pole Bean. @ 50 seeds. French varietal originally from the village of Tarbais in the South of France. This skin with rich flavour. The bean of classic French Cassoulet of 'Lamb and Vegetable'.



Jacobs Cattle Bush Semi Bush: \$3.25

Dry, quick cooking, for soups or baked.



Magpie Bean: \$3.25

Magpie Bean Snap or dry bush bean. 65 Days to maturity. Black and white seed with buttery flavour. Approx. 50 seeds per person.



Rattlesnake Snap: \$3.25

60 - 90 Days to Maturity. Pole snap bean. 7"-8" dark green pods streaked with purple - drought tolerant, great flavour. Buff seed splashed with brown.



Sayamusume Edamame Soy: \$3.25

The best edamame we've found yet. Large plants with large pods. 20 grams per packet.



Soldier: \$3.25

80 to 90 Days to Maturity. Dry bush bean. Heirloom from the late 1700's. Drought tolerant, white seed with red, brown soldier.



Tigers Eye: \$3.25

Dry, bush, ternder skins, great for chili.



True Cranberry Bean: \$3.25

Deep red, plump bean with a long history in the U.S. North East. Excellent flavour, use in chili's soups and baked beans. Dry, Pole bean. 95 days from planting. 50 seeds per packet.



Vegetables/Beans

Turkey Craw Bean: \$3.25

Supposedly found in the craw of a turkey, origin goes back to 1902. Has been elected to the U.S.Slow Food Ark of taste. 50 seeds per packet.

Vegetables/Beets



Cyndor Beet: \$3.25

Beta vulgaris Classic cylinder shaped red beet, consistent size and shape. Good productivity, good for slicing, sweeter flavour than most red beets.

Vegetables/Cabbage



Cabbage - Red Acre: \$3.25

(Brassica oleracea) 75 Days. One of the beest open pollinated Red Cabbages. 1 1.5 kg. head.

Vegetables/Carrots



Dutch Golden: \$3.25

Beautiful golden carrot, always tender, even when very large (which it can get in a long season). Found on our travels in Europe. Sunshine Farm Favorite and exclusive. Tested by Washington State University in exotic carrot field trials, where it scored high in all categories. Approx. 200 seeds per packet.



Purple Dragon Carrot: \$3.25

Beautiful vibrant purple skinned variety. Introduced from China to North America by Dr. John Navazio. Sweet spicy carrot flavour. Approx. 200 seeds per packet.



Rouge Sang Violette: \$3.25

Beautiful and unusual French variety mentioned in the Journal D'agriculture Pratique 1897 by Vilmorin. Approx. 200 seeds per packet.



Spectrum Carrots: \$3.25

A delightful mix of colours, flavours, and varieties. Diverse colours may not be exactly as shown. Approx. 200 seeds per packet.

Red Rhubarb Chard: \$3.25

Red Rhubarb Chard (Beta vulgaris) 60 Days to Maturity. Use baby leaves for salad. Beautiful large green savoyed leaves with red veins and stems. Excellent flavour.

Vegetables/Corn



Black Aztec: \$3.25

Black Aztec Corn (Zea mays) Original Aztec corn with a 2000+year history. Great as a sweet corn in at the immature (milk) stage. 2-3 cobs per 6'-8'plant. Nice for dark corn flour when dried. Approx. 100 seeds per packet.



Corn, Golden Bantam: \$3.25

Golden Bantam Corn (DFP75+) Ancestor of many of the modern day hybrids. Has long been the standard open pollinated golden sweet corn variety. Approx. 100 seeds per packet.



Corn, Hopi Blue: \$3.25




