Aster, China: \$3.50

(Callistephus chinensis) Lovely Matsumota Mix wide colour range of 5 cm. blooms with yellow centers. Heat tolerant, strong straight stems and long bloom period. Great for cutting. Approx 100 seeds per packet.



Batchelors button: \$3.50

(Centaurea cyanus) (Annual) Mixed colours. Edible. Min. 100 seeds per packet.



Blanket Flower: \$3.50

(Gaillardia aristata) (Perennial) Beautiful yellow/red. Drought tolerant. Approx. 100 seeds per packet.



Calendula: \$3.50

(Calendula officinalis) Deep orange and gold. Edible flower. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Canterbury Bells: \$3.50

(Campanula glomerata) Biennial. Seed originally from Ireland. Mixed blues, pink and white bell shaped flowers to 2' tall. Min. 500 seeds.



Cleome: \$3.50

Cleome-Spider Flower (C. spinosa) Nice tall plant with pink and white 'spider like' flowers. Approx. .25 gram per packet.



Columbine, mixed: \$3.50

(Aquilegia alpina) (Perennial) - Mixed colours. Beautiful spring flower.

Cosmos: \$3.50

(Cosmos bipinnatus) (Annual) Nice tall plant, purple and white flowers with lacy foliage.



Cup Plant: \$3.50

Perennial (Silphium perfoliatum) Sunflower like flowers with leaves attached to stems to form cups - finches and chickadees love the seeds and drinking from the cups. Min. 50 seeds.



Daisy, Zulu Prince: \$3.50

(Venidium fastuosum) (Annual) Nice delicate two tone.



Delphinium: \$3.50

Beautiful stately blue. Juice of the flowers mixed with alum gives blue ink. (Toxic to humans and livestock)



Ebony Shoe Fly: \$3.50

(Nicandra physalodes) (Annual) Blue Bell Flower. Large plant with black stems. Speckled foliage. Approx. 450 seeds per packet.



Edible Flower Collection: \$10.00

Edible Flower Collection. A collection of edible flowers for salads, garnishes, and desserts. Calendula, Corn Flower, Zebra Mallow, Orange Gem Marigold and Pansy.



Foxglove: \$3.50

(Digitalis purpurea) (Biennial) Pink. Wild Welsh variety, approx. 1. meter tall. Min. 100 seeds.



Gazania: \$3.50

Gazania rigens. Beautiful brilliant colours. Drought tolerant, daisy-like flower. Cultivation: Annual, blooms late spring into the Autumn.



Geranium - Apple scented: \$3.50

Perennial (Pelargonium odoratissiumum) Tender perennial. Upright compact plant that seeds quite readily and has a delightful apple scent. Min. 25 seeds per packet.

Geranium, coconut scented: \$3.50

Coconut Scented Geranium: Pelargonium sp. Tender perennial. Small leaved, very interesting scent resembling coconut, pretty small pink flowers. Nice in a hanging pot. Min. 25 seeds per packet.



Gloriosa Daisy: \$3.50

(Rudbeckia hirta) (Perennial) Yellow, brown center.classic yellow daisy.



Jackpot Tansy: \$3.50

(Tanacetum niveum) (Perennial) Silver grey foliage with white/yellow flowers. Not invasive.



Johnny Jump-up: \$3.50

Johnny Jump-up (Viola tricolor) Historic small pansy, harbinger of spring. Edible. Approx. 25 seeds per packet.



Kingfisher Daisy: \$3.50

Felicia amelloides. Showy, sky blue daisy, bright yellow center. Good Butterfly plant. Drought tolerant, annual, 18" tall. Blooms late spring through autumn.



Leopard Flower: \$3.50

(Belamcanda chinensis) (Perennial) Beautiful orange flowers with purple dots. Chinese medicinal. Approx. 45 Seeds per packet.



Lions Ear-Lions Tail: \$3.50

Lions Ear-Lions Tail (Leonotis leonurus) (Annual) Tall, deep orange florets on prickly leaf axils, used as a euphoriant in Africa. Min 250 seeds per packet.



Mallow, Zebra: \$3.50

(Malva sp.) Annual. Beautiful sweet edible, red/white blooms. Approx. 150 seeds per packet.



Marigold, Orange Gem: \$3.50

(Tagetes tenuifolia) (Annual) Citrus scented/flavoured. Approx. 200 Seeds per packet.



Flowers

Pin Cushion Flower: \$3.50

Scabiosa sp. Beautiful deep burgundy variety. Attractive to many butterflies. Annual, blooms freely into the Autumn. 12 to 16" tall.



Purple Cone Flower: \$3.50

(Echinacea purpurea) (Perennial) Beautiful, medicinal. Echinacea is popularly believed to be an immunostimulator, stimulating the body's non-specific immune system and warding off infections and also being used as a laxative. Min. 75 seeds per packet.



Red Amaranthus: \$3.50

Amaranthus cruentus. Ancient grain of the Aztec, can grow over 6', stunning colour displays. Seed can be popped and eaten as a snack. Approx. 400 seeds per packet.



Sea Holly: \$3.50

(Eryngium planum) (Perennial) Soft prickly, blue flowered. Drought tolerant. Attracts beneficial insects. Min. 150 seeds per packet.



Snapdragon: \$3.50

(Antirrhinum majus) (Perennial) Mixed colours.



Viola, Fuji Dawn: \$3.50

Fuji Dawn Viola (Viola mandshurica) Free flowering, variegated foliage. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Yarrow, Red: \$3.50

(Achillea millefolium) (Perennial) Lovely red flower heads. Seeds can be slow to germinate, soak for 24 hours before planting. Approx .25g/pkg



Zinnia: \$3.50

(Zinnia elegans) (Annual) - Giant Zinnia. Mixed colours. Drought tolerant.

Ornamental: \$3.50

(Helianthus annuus) Mixed colours. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

Aster, Showy: \$3.50

(Aster conspicuus) Wild perennial. Blue Flowers. Native peoples used roots as an antiseptic. Seed naturalized to Sunshine Farm. Min 100 seeds per packet.



Daisy, Arrow Park: \$3.50

(Anthemis tinctoria) Yellow. Excellent drought tolerant perennial. Seed naturalized to Sunshine Farm. Mln. 100 seeds per packet.



Fireweed: \$3.50

Fireweed. (Elobium angustifolium) Spiked pink flower. Tall 3' to 4'. Min. 100 seeds per packet.



Lupin, Columbia Valley Wild: \$3.50

Columbia Valley Wild Lupin: Tall plant to 3', blue flowers, occasionally pink. Seed naturalized to Sunshine Farm. Min. 20 seeds per packet.





Aunt Mollys Ground Cherry: \$3.50

Physalis pruiniosa Profusion of small sweet berries encased in papery husks. Sprawling plants to 3 feet. 70 days from transplanting. Approx 50 seeds per packet.



Beet Berry: \$3.50

Chenopodium capitatum. Annual . Also called Strawberry Spinach. Edible leaves, good in salad or cooked like spinach. Edible root, which is similar to Parsnip. Fruits along leaf axils that look like raspberries. Annual, to 16" tall. Approx. 100 seeds per packet.

Fire and Ice Berry: \$3.50

Solanum sisymbriifolium. Annual. Also known as the Litchi Tomato. 2 to 3 cm red berry. Yellow inside, grows inside a husk like a tomatillo, flavour resembles a sour cherry. Annual. Prolific fruit in early fall. Prickly foliage. Approx. 30 seeds.



Ground Cherry or Cape Gooseberry/Poha: \$3.50

Annual (Physalis Peruvians) Ground Cherry or Cape Gooseberry AKA Poha. Upright ground cherry with loonie sized fruit. Pineapple-strawberry flavour with a hint of coconut. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Hearts of Gold Melon: \$3.50

Cucumis melo. 70-90 days Aromatic 2-3 lb fruits with sweet golden flesh. Reliable and productive. Heirloom from early 1900's. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Melon, Charentais: \$3.50

Small French melon, deep orange flesh, considered by many to be the tastiest of all melons. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Melon, Isreal Ogen: \$3.50

C. melon. 80-90 Days. Beautiful sweet, pale green flesh. Intoxicating aroma. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Melon, Minnesota Midget: \$3.50

Minnesota Midget Melon (Cucumis melo) 60-70 Days. Early variety, sweet, short vines. Productive, performed exceptionally well in the Okanagan Valley. Approx. 30 seeds per packet.



Orange Glo Watermelon: \$3.50

Citrullus lanatus. Orange fleshed watermelon. 5-10lbs. Sweet, around 110 days from transplant. Approx. 30 Seeds per packet.

Sunberry: \$3.50

Sunberry (Solanum burbankii) 75 Days. Also known as 'wonderberry' developed by Luther Burbank, plant breeder genius. Small 1/4" berries. Good yield. Sweet, used for Pies and Jellies or just for snacking in the field. Approx. 200 Seeds per packet.

Grains



Emmer Wheat: \$3.50

Triticum dicoccum. Also known as Farro. Grown extensively in Italy as a whole grain in soup and for making Pasta.



Millet, Dragons Claw: \$3.50

Dragons Claw Millet (Eleusine sp.)(approx 80 seeds) Unusual Millet with the heat that resembles the 'claws of a dragaon'.



Wheat, Marquis: \$3.50

Marquis Wheat (Triticum aestivum) Heritage wheat variety developed by crossing Hard Red Calcutta wheat with Red Fife. By 1920 it was the predominant variety in Canada. Early maturing variety.



Wheat, Red Fife: \$3.50

Red Fife Wheat (Triticum aestivum) Heritage breadwheat is a landrace so it has the genetic variability to adapt to local conditions. Grown in Canada since the 1840's.

Arugula, Ortania: \$3.50

Arugula, Ortania (Annual) (Eruca sativa varietal) Special Market selection of Italian Arugula, consistent growth and flavour. Approx. 500 seeds per packet.



Arugula, Wild Italian: \$3.50

(Diplotaxis tenuifolia) (Annual) Great Flavour. Stands up better in heat than eruca sativa.

A salad or steaming mix of mizuna, mustard greens, bok choi, tat soi - nice quick spring crop - sow in late March or early September for fall crop. Approx. 800 Seeds

Ching Chiang : \$3.50

Brassica rapa 'Baby Bok Choi' 25 to 30 days. Fast, cold tolerant. Nice for steaming or grilling.



Claytonia: \$3.50

Asian Greens: \$3.50

Claytonia perfoliata. Also known as Miners Lettuce. Succulent crunchy green. Grows best in spring and fall.



Corn Salad, Vilmorins: \$3.50

(Valerianella locusta) Classic French variety, great cool weather salad green with distinctive sweet flavour. Approx. 650 Seeds per packet.



Cress, shallot: \$3.50

Shallot Cress (Lepidium sp) Interesting spoon shaped leaves with a peppery oniony flavour. Nice in the spicy salad mixes. Prefers the cool of the spring or fall. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Cress, Upland: \$3.50

(Barberea verna) Piquant 6"-8" rosettes of dark green glossy deeply indented leaves. Slow to bolt. Approx. 600 Seeds per packet.



Green Orach: \$3.50

Atriplex hortensis. Use as spinach. Tolerant of hot weather. Annual.



Kale, Red Russian: \$3.50

Cold hardy, frilly leafed, purple/pink veins. Delicious at any stage. Eat fresh or steamed. Also delicious as 'Kale Chips'.



Mizuna: \$3.50

(Brassica rapa var japonica)(Annual) Beautiful deeply cut leaves of mild mustard flavor. Steamed or in salad.

Mustard Greens, Ruby Streaks: \$3.50

Ruby Streaks Mustard Greens. Beautiful deep burgundy lacy leaf with sweet spiciness. Colourful elegance. Approx. 1000 Seeds per packet.



Orach, Red: \$3.50

(Artiplex hortensis) (45 Days to maturity)(Annual) Nice red Spinachy flavoured addition to salads.



Pepper Grass, Curly: \$3.50

Lepidium sativum Looks almost like curled parsley, nice spicy addition to salads or sandwiches. Rapid growing, harvest 2 weeks after sowing, keep clipped and succession plant for continuous supply.



Purslane, Golden: \$3.50

(Portulaca oleracea sativa) Large succulent leaves excellent source of omega 3, great in salad mixes.



Quillquina: \$3.50

(Porophyllum ruderale)(Annual) Culinary and medicinal from Bolivia, reminiscent of cilantro and arugula cross. Approx. 50 Seeds per packet.



Salad Mix, Savory: \$3.50

Salad Mix, Savory: Dill, chervil, arugula, lettuce, and mustard greens. A nice savory blend of flavours and shapes and textures. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Salad mix, Spicy: \$3.50

Salad mix with peppergrass, mustard varieties, arugulas and lettuces. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Salad mix, Spring: \$3.50

Early salad mix with mizuna, tatsoi, spinach, sweet mustard and lettuce mix. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.



Salad Mix, Tangy: \$3.50

Tangy Salad Mix - Chives, lettuce, mustard greens, cress, arugula and cilantro. Wake up your taste buds with a spicy salad. Approx. 700 Seeds per packet.

Sorrel, True French: \$3.50

(Rumex scutatus) (Perennial) Lemony zing to salads or soups.



Sorrel, Red Veined: \$3.50

(Rumex sanguineus) Interesting colour but lacks flavour. Chefs use as a colourful garnish. Use only when young.



Spilanthes Cress: \$3.50

(Spelanthis oleracea)(Annual) Also called the toothache plant, adds unusual zest to salads. Approx. .5 gram per packet.



Zamboni Rapini: \$3.50

Brassica sp. Produces florets at about 45 days. Excellent in stir frys with olive oil and garlic. Keep picked to maximize production.





Ambrosia: \$3.50

(Chenopoduim botrys) (Annual) Aromatic oak shaped leaves. Nice dried foliage.



Anise Hyssop: \$3.50

(Agastache foeniculum) Prolific, sweet licorice herb with striking blue flowers. Self seeds quite nicely.

Basil, Holy: \$3.50

(Ocimum sp.) Peppery Sweet, Thai culinary.



Basil, Mexican Wild: \$3.50

Mexican Wild Basil: Found by the roadside near Boca de Naranja, Nayarit, Mexico. Absolutely the fruitiest fragrance of any basil we've grown -- sweet and not pungent. Sunshine Farm Exclusive.

Very beautiful leaves, ruffled and serrated, good culinary and very decorative.



Bergamot, Wild: \$3.50

Basil, Seratta: \$3.50

Approximately 500 seeds.

Wild Bergamot (P) (Monarda fistulosa) (.5 g per packet) Tall lavender flowers, attractive fragrant plant, good for teas. Approx. .5 gram per packet.



Catnip: \$3.50

(nepeta cataria) Perennial. Traditional variety - apparently more effective than DEET as a mosquito repellant.



Chamomile, German: \$3.50

(Matricaria recutita) (Annual) Probably the best for tea, a profusion of flowers, very aromatic.



Chinese Motherwort: \$3.50

(Leonuris artemesia) Medicinal and decorative herb. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Chives: \$3.50

(Allium schoenoprasum) (Biennnial) Traditional variety.



Cilantro: \$3.50

(Coriandrum sativum) Annual. Spicy herb used in Mexican and Thai cuisine.j Attracts beneficials. Approx. 100 Seeds per packet.



Dill: \$3.50

(Anethum graveolens)(Annual) Mammoth, good salad garnish when young, and nice seed heads for making pickles. Large plant.



Dragon Head: \$3.50

(Dracochephalum moldavica) Lemony scented blue flowered tea herb, to 50 cm. tall. (approx 150 seeds per packet)

Echinacea purpurea. Also known as Purple Coneflower. Perennial, beautiful displays of vivid pink flowers. Immune stimulant.



Elecampane: \$3.50

Echinacea: \$3.50

(Inula helenium) (Perennial) Medicinal and dye plant. Large soft leaves.



Epazote: \$3.50

(Chenopodium ambrosioides) (Annual) Exellent aromatic, good with baked beans, reputed antiflatulant.



Evening Primrose: \$3.50

(Oenothera biennis) (Biennial) Medicinal as seed oil. Attracts hawkmoth.



Feverfew: \$3.50

Feverfew (P) (Selma star)(Tanacetum parthemium)(.5 g per packet) Traditional medicinal qualities for headaches and migranes with very pretty white star flowers.



Horehound: \$3.50

(Marrubium vulgare) Perennial. Traditional remedy for coughs.



Hyssop - Giant Yellow: \$3.50

(Agastache nepetoides) Tender Perennial. 6' tall, yellow bloom. Medium sweet leaves, nice for tea.



Hyssop, Blue: \$3.50

(Hyssopus officinalis)(Perennial) Blue flowers, refreshing scent. Approx. 150 seeds per packet.

Hyssop, Giant Yellow: \$3.50

Giant Yellow Hyssop (TP) (Agastache nepetoides) (.5 g per packet) 6\' tall, yellow bloom. Medium sweet leaves, nice for tea.

Joe Pye Weed: \$3.50

Joe Pye Weed. (Eupatoruim purpureum) 12 foot herb with white cluster flowers. Leaves have diuretic properties.



Lavender: \$3.50

(Lavendula angustifolia) (Perennial) English, sweet, fragrant violet flowers. Approx. 40 seeds per packet.



Lemon Balm: \$3.50

(Melissa officinalis) (Perennial) Great lemon scent - good for tea and salad.



Lovage: \$3.50

(Levisticum officinale) Perennial. Great for soups, stocks and stews. Celery flavoured, tall vigorous plant. Approx. 75 seeds per packet.



Marjoram, Sweet: \$3.50

(Origanum marjorana) Tender Perennial. Sweet, spicy flavour, good with wild game and potato soup.



Mullein, Black: \$3.50

Culpeppers Black Mullein (B) (Verbascum sp) Short wooly leaves. Rosette in 1st year then flower stalk in 2nd year (Drought resistant) Interesting flower. Approx. .5 per packet.



Mullein, Great: \$3.50

(Verbascum thapsus) Biennial. Reputed cough/bronchitis remedy - stately plant to 7' with yellow flowers in the 2nd year.



Navaho Tea: \$3.50

(Thelasperma fillifolium) Very nice pleasant tasting tea herb. Pretty flowers, lacy foliage.



Oregano, Greek: \$3.50

(Origanum vulgare) (Perennial) Best oregano flavour for sauces and dressings. White flowers.

Oregano, Tarahumara: \$3.50

(Monarda astromontana) Not a true oregano, beautiful blue flowers, very aromatic. Excellent tea and garnish herb. Approx 100 seeds per packet.



Parsley, Forest Green: \$3.50

(Petroselinum crispum) (Biennial) Curled leaf, prolific. Recovers well from harvesting. Minimum 200 seeds.



Parsley, Hamburg: \$3.50

(Petroselinum crispum tuberosum) (Biennial) Use both leaves and root, very tasty.



Sage: \$3.50

(Salvia officinalis) (Perennial) Garden variety, cook with onions, for poultry stuffing.



Savory - Winter Dwarf: \$3.50

(Satureja montana) Perennial. Useful for culinary, pungent flavour, though not as aromatic as 'hortensis'.



Shepards Purse: \$3.50

Capsela bursa-pastoris. Used as food in East Asia as well as a medicinal for cardiovascular, hemostasis, and gynecological problems. Good in East Asian cuisine. Minimum 50 seeds per packet.



Tobacco, 1000 Year Old : \$3.50

Tobacco, 1000 Year Old (T. rustica sp) Small plant, yellow flower, from Salt spring Seeds. grows well in Interior dry climate. Important ceremonial herb. Min. 100 seeds.



Tobacco, Shamans: \$3.50

Seed from George, a Cree Shaman friend. 6 - 8 foot plant for offerings.



Tomatillo May 16, 2017



Francois Tomatillo: \$3.50

Francois Tomatillo, exceptionally large green 6- 8 cm fruits. Sweet green apple flavour. Brought from Mexico by a famous chef. Excellent for sauces and fresh eating. Approx. 50 seeds.

Vegetables/Beans (Phaseolus vulgaris)

Anasazi Bean: \$3.50



Anasazi Bean (80 to 90 Days to Maturity) Dry Bush Bean. Beautiful maroon and white bean, grown by the ancient Anasazi People of the American Southwest. Contains only 25% of the complex carbohydrates that cause flatulance. Sweet meaty texture. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

Appaloosa Bean: \$3.50

Heirloom variety, slender, curved oval bean with mottled white markings. When cooked, the bean holds it's shape. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

Azufrado Bean: \$3.50

Azufrado Bean Dry Bush Bean. 80 to 90 Days to Maturity. Classic Mexican Yellow Bean. Most common market bean in the Pacific State of Nayarit, seed originally from Market in Lapenita, Nayarit. Produces well in the Okanagan Valley.

Big Mama Pole Bean: \$3.50

Big Mama Pole Bean: Soup and Dry Pole Bean. Productive vines, black seed.

Black Coco: \$3.50

Shiny round black beans. Delicious for baked beans, with a hint of cocoa flavour. Dry or snap when young. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

Black Turtle Bean: \$3.50

Small shiny black bean. Used in Latin American and Cajun cuisine. Gram for gram more antioxidant/flavonoids than any other bean. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

Cherokee Trail of Tears: \$3.50

80-90 Days to maturity. Pole, 6' snap or dry bean. Cherokee people carried the seed to their reserve in Oklahoma in 1838 over the 'trail of tears' where many people died due to starvation. Black seed. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.

French Wax Bean: \$3.50

French Wax Yellow Bean 53 Days to Maturity. Productive and versatile wax variety. Glossy, crisp yellow pods on 16-24" plants. Rich, buttery flavour. Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Haricot Tarbais: \$3.50

Haricot Tarbais (80 to 90 Days to Maturity) Dry Pole Bean. @ 50 seeds. French varietal originally from the village of Tarbais in the South of France. This skin with rich flavour. The bean of classic French Cassoulet of 'Lamb and Vegetable'.



Jacobs Cattle Bush Semi Bush: \$3.50

Dry, quick cooking, for soups or baked.



Jade Bush: \$3.50

(65 Days to maturity) Tall, tender, prolific, snap.



Jumbo Bush: \$3.50

Romano type bean. Long pods, with rich bean flavour. Still stringless at 10". Approx. 50 seeds per packet.



Magpie Bean: \$3.50

Magpie Bean Snap or dry bush bean. 65 Days to maturity. Black and white seed with buttery flavour. Approx. 50 seeds per person.



Maxibel: \$3.50

Snap, Bush, Bean 60 days Straight, dark green, 7 inch pods on 22-26 inch sturdy plants. concentrated sets are easy to harvest. Excellent flavor. Perfect for flavor conscious gardeners looking for French/filet beans without trellising. Mottled purple seeds. @50 seeds.



Nance: \$3.50

Nance Snap Bean Slender, sweet, snap bean which holds through cooking and processing. Off-white with black specks. Vigorous and productive. Very rare. Snap, Semi-vining 50-60days @50 seeds.

Black and white beans with the black spot for the eye of the orca. Good multipurpose dry bean.



Rattlesnake Snap: \$3.50

60 - 90 Days to Maturity. Pole snap bean. 7"-8" dark green pods streaked with purple - drought tolerant, great flavour. Buff seed splashed with brown.

Red Calypso: \$3.50

Dry or Snap Bush Bean Young as a snap, 90 days as a dry. Beautiful distinctive red and white markings. Soft skins, nice texture. Approx 50 seeds/pkg



Slendrette Bean: \$3.50
