This site discusses the Aboriginal Plant Trail through the Gardens. The trail is designed for students in years R to 3. On the trail students develop an understanding of traditional Aboriginal lifestyle by discovering the different ways plants were used by Aboriginal people. Students are encouraged to observe, record and analyse as they learn about Aboriginal knowledge of the natural environment. It gives useful background information about the plants and the Aboriginal group that used them, including Kaurna people.
