

Styrax benzoin

Styrax benzoin is a species of tree native to Sumatra in Indonesia. Common names for the tree include **gum benzoin tree**, **loban** (in Arabic), **kemenyan** (in Indonesia and Malaysia), **onycha**, and **Sumatra benzoin tree**.^[1]

1 Distribution

It is a common member of the forests of Sumatra, where it grows to about 12 meters in maximum height.^[2]

2 Cultivation

Styrax benzoin is cultivated as a main source of benzoin resin in Indonesia. It is also grown as an ornamental tree for shade in West Africa.
