- Fruit is used as a chocolate substitute, Carob.
- Fruit is high in sugar and protein

- Gray bark can become warty
- Native of the Mediterranean where it grows on rocky soils, in foothills near the coast
- Tough durable plant prefers full sun, good drainage and low amounts of summer water
- Well adapted to inland, valleys and low desert
- Used as street tree, in parking areas and shade tree in non-grass areas
- Can be pruned into a large hedge
- Pod litter a nuisance
