

| Characteristics

The Tolu tree (*Myroxylon balsamum*) comes from Central American tropical forests. It is also cultivated across Latin America and India.

Liquid Tolu resin also called balsam is collected after incisions are made in the bark of trees that are more than five years old.

Gathered in cups attached to the tree trunk, the balsam is a thick, resinous substance with a semi-liquid consistency.

The balsam solidifies with exposure to air and becomes brown and brittle with time

Resin is collected from the trees between December and April.

Firmenich sources this natural balsamic resin from Colombia.
